**Notice of Spring Election and
Sample Ballot
April 4, 2017**

OFFICE OF THE BROWN COUNTY CLERK
TO THE VOTERS OF BROWN COUNTY:

Notice is hereby given of a spring election to be held in Brown County, WI on Tuesday, April 4, 2017, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office to be voted for, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, for a referendum, if any, in the sample ballot below.

INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place, a voter shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If a voter is not registered to vote, a voter may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence, if the voter presents proof of residence in a form specified by law. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall retire alone to a voting booth and cast his or her ballot except that a voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device* ("Automark") to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen at the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

The vote should not be cast in any other manner. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth or machine. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in casting his or her vote may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

If the voter spoils an optical scan ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. After casting his or her vote, the voter shall leave the booth, insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

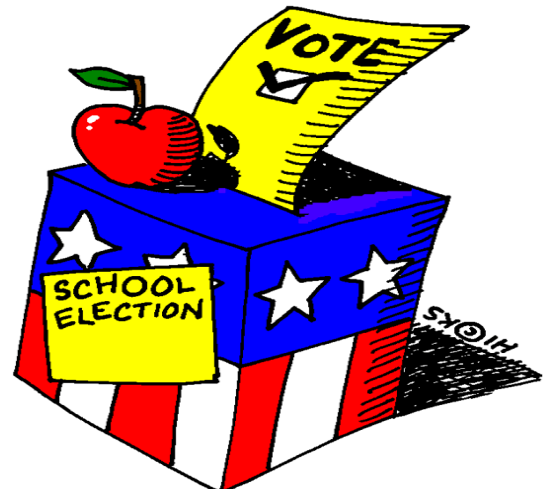

**NOTICE OF REFERENDUM
GREEN BAY AREA PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT
APRIL 4, 2017**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the Green Bay Area Public School District on April 4, 2017, the following proposed Resolution Authorizing School District Budget to Exceed Revenue Limit and Initial Resolution of the School Board will be submitted to a vote of the people:

RESOLUTION NUMBER I

RESOLUTION
AUTHORIZING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET TO
EXCEED REVENUE LIMIT BY \$16,500,000 A YEAR FOR TEN YEARS
FOR NON-RECURRING PURPOSES

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the Green Bay Area Public School District, Brown County, Wisconsin that the revenues included in the School District budget be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$16,500,000 for the 2017-2018 school year and for each of the succeeding 9 school years thereafter, for non-recurring purposes consisting of: maintaining educational programming and class sizes; and retaining staff.

RESOLUTION NUMBER II

INITIAL RESOLUTION
AUTHORIZING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS
IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$68,250,000

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the Green Bay Area Public School District, Brown County, Wisconsin that there shall be issued pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$68,250,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a district-wide school building and facilities improvement plan consisting of: reconstruction of Baird Elementary School; additions, renovations and improvements to increase capacity, to provide safe and secure entrances and offices at multiple elementary schools, and to improve instructional, support and community service spaces; renovations and improvements for fine arts facilities; and acquisition of related furnishings, fixtures and equipment.

The questions will appear on the ballot as follows:

QUESTION NUMBER I

“Shall the Green Bay Area Public School District, Brown County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$16,500,000 for the 2017-2018 school year and for each of the succeeding 9 school years thereafter, for non-recurring purposes consisting of: maintaining educational programming and class sizes; and retaining staff?”

QUESTION NUMBER II

“Shall the Green Bay Area Public School District, Brown County, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$68,250,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a district-wide school building and facilities improvement plan consisting of: reconstruction of Baird Elementary School; additions, renovations and improvements to increase capacity, to provide safe and secure entrances and offices at multiple elementary schools, and to improve instructional, support and community service spaces; renovations and improvements for fine arts facilities; and acquisition of related furnishings, fixtures and equipment?”

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT AND EFFECT OF VOTE

The referendum election ballot will ask District electors to vote “yes” or “no” on the referendum election questions as set forth above.

A “yes” vote on Question Number I is a vote to authorize the Green Bay Area Public School District budget to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$16,500,000 for the 2017-2018 school year and for each of the succeeding 9 school years thereafter, for non-recurring purposes consisting of: maintaining educational programming and class sizes; and retaining staff.

A “no” vote on Question Number I is a vote to deny the Green Bay Area Public School District budget the authority to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$16,500,000 for the 2017-2018 school year and for each of the succeeding 9 school years thereafter, for non-recurring purposes consisting of: maintaining educational programming and class sizes; and retaining staff.

In the event a majority of the electors voting on Question I vote “yes”, the District will be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$16,500,000 for the 2017-2018 school year and for each of the succeeding 9 school years thereafter, for non-recurring purposes consisting of: maintaining educational programming and class sizes; and retaining staff; if a majority vote “no” on the question set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

A “yes” vote on Question Number II is a vote to approve the borrowing of \$68,250,000 by the Green Bay Area Public School District through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of a district-wide school building and facilities improvement plan consisting of: reconstruction of Baird Elementary School; additions, renovations and improvements to increase capacity, to provide safe and secure entrances and offices at multiple elementary schools, and to improve instructional, support and community service spaces; renovations and improvements for fine arts facilities; and acquisition of related furnishings, fixtures and equipment.

A “no” vote on Question Number II is a vote to deny the Green Bay Area Public School District the authority to borrow \$68,250,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of a district-wide school building and facilities improvement plan consisting of: reconstruction of Baird Elementary School; additions, renovations and improvements to increase capacity, to provide safe and secure entrances and offices at multiple elementary schools, and to improve instructional, support and community service spaces; renovations and improvements for fine arts facilities; and acquisition of related furnishings, fixtures and equipment.

In the event a majority of the electors voting on Question Number II vote “yes”, the District will be authorized to undertake the school building improvement program described in Question Number II and borrow not in excess of \$68,250,000 therefor; if a majority vote “no” on Question Number II set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the Howard-Suamico School District, Brown County, Wisconsin that the revenues included in the School District budget be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for the 2017-2018 school year and thereafter by \$4,000,000, for recurring purposes consisting of added student support, employee compensation, and facility maintenance.

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

"Shall the Howard-Suamico School District, Brown County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for the 2017-2018 school year and thereafter by \$4,000,000, for recurring purposes consisting of added student support, employee compensation, and facility maintenance?"

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT AND EFFECT OF VOTE

The referendum election ballot will ask District electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum election question as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on the question is in favor of said Resolution and is a vote to authorize the Howard-Suamico School District budget to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for the 2017-2018 school year and thereafter by \$4,000,000, for recurring purposes consisting of added student support, employee compensation, and facility maintenance.

A "no" vote on the question is opposed to said Resolution and is a vote to deny the Howard-Suamico School District budget the authority to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for the 2017-2018 school year and thereafter by \$4,000,000, for recurring purposes consisting of added student support, employee compensation, and facility maintenance.

In the event a majority of the electors voting vote "yes" on the question, the District will be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for the 2017-2018 school year and thereafter by \$4,000,000, for recurring purposes consisting of added student support, employee compensation, and facility maintenance; if a majority vote "no" on the question set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

DO I NEED A SPECIAL VOTER ID CARD?

There is not a separate "Voter ID" card. There are many forms of Photo ID, which you may already have, that can be used to vote.

Anyone with a valid Wisconsin driver license or Wisconsin state ID card, or any of the documents listed below, already has the photo ID they need for voting purposes.

WHAT CAN I USE AS PHOTO ID TO VOTE?

The following photo IDs are acceptable for voting purposes, and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election (currently, the November 8, 2016 election):

- A Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended
- A Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card
- Military ID card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services
- A U.S. passport book or card

The following photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes:

- A driver license receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
- An identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
- A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college, or technical college that contains the following:

- ⇒ Date the card was issued
- ⇒ Signature of student
- ⇒ Expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance
- ⇒ The university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment, such as a tuition fee receipt, enrollment verification letter, or class schedule

WHAT WILL THE POLL WORKER BE LOOKING AT ON MY PHOTO ID?

- Elector's Photograph

The photograph must reasonably resemble the elector.

- Elector's Name

The elector's name must conform to the name on their voter registration; conform does not mean that the name must be identical to the name on the voter registration.

- An Expiration Date

If the ID has an expiration date, it must meet the expiration requirements listed above.

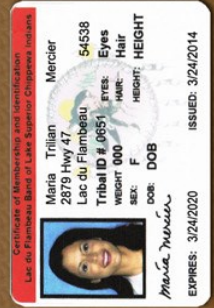
