This is a busy time of year for farmers. They are harvesting their corn fields, hauling manure and tilling their fields. So please be patient and drive safely around farm equipment.



Hi Friends,

Rockland continues to be a great place to live. The flooding in Texas and Louisiana, over 2 dozen terrible fires in California and Oregon and as I write this letter another huge hurricane is headed towards Florida. My brother in Arizona tells me it has been over 100 degrees pretty much all summer long. You gotta love Wisconsin!

Meanwhile, Rockland has just about finished up our road work for the year. Overall, they are holding up well even with the heavy trucks hauling manure. Scott Construction Company did the resurfacing work (chip sealing); with the exception of some excess loose gravel they did a good job. If you have any questions or concerns, just give one of us on the Board a call.

In October, we will be putting together the budget for next year. Unlike the state or some cities, I don't foresee any new taxes. Wisconsin is 2 months late adopting their budget with the big fight over road funding. Raising gas tax or toll roads was an option. Green Bay was looking at a wheel tax assessed at vehicle registration. I my opinion, they really need to look at how the money is spent. A recent audit of DOT shows there is room and need for better over site especially on cost overruns on most projects. Spending other people's money seems to be easy. Again, any questions or concerns, give us a call.

Lastly, the city of De Pere continues to ignore Rocklands' plea to work together. They are black topping Old Plank Road near our border, and a Rockland resident asked that a culvert be replaced and moved a few feet north before the work is done. Not only did they say NO, but also said they didn't want Rocklands water. They are simply not good neighbors. That's it for now.

# **Recycling News**

Did you know that you can recycle milk cartons, juice cartons, sour cream containers cottage cheese containers, yogurt containers, and produce and delicontainers? Yes these can all be put in the recycling bin.

What do I do with plastic bags? Plastic bags are recyclable but NOT through curbside program. Bring your plastic bags to a local retail or grocery store to be recycled.

Should I remove bottle caps? YES remove the bottle caps is a good recycling habit. When caps are left on the liquids stay in the bottle which makes it difficult for the machinery to properly sort the plastic. Also the small size of the caps end up in our glass collection system which makes our glass less valuable to a buyer.

What do I do with shredded paper? Put the shredded paper in a paper bag, staple it closed, label the bag and put in your curbside container.

What do I do with Styrofoam? Recycling does not accept Styrofoam as very few markets are available. So Styrofoam must go in the garbage.

Televisions, computers, DVD/VCR players, fax machines, mice, speakers, flash drives, hard drives, and cell phones are banned from landfill disposal. Cyber works accepts these items. They are located at 844 Willard Drive in Green Bay. Also in April the Town of Rockland will hold another electronics recycling day.

At the Tri-County Recycling Facility, over 1000,000 tons of recyclables are processed each year utilizing staff from a two-shift operation. The recyclables are separated by hand and compressed into storage bales for easy shipping.

They are marketed and sold to companies to be re-manufactured into a wide array of new products.

Keep up recycling in the Town of Rockland. The Town is doing a good job. We are meeting the State mandated weight each year.

This helps us get a grant each year. The grant money is used to help pay the cost of pick up of recyclables in the Town of Rockland.
