### A NOTE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

In the month of October, we will be cutting the grass in the ditches on town roads to the backside of the ditch. This process removes all vegetation and keeps the ditches clean for water flow.

The Town just finished widening Tetzlaff Road from eighteen feet to twenty-six feet and adding approximately ten inches of gravel to the entire roadbed. Then we applied a double chip seal to the roadbed. This project was approved for the T.R.I.P. program from the state and we will receive a little over \$13,000.00 in grant money from this program.

With Fall upon us, so is harvesting season for the farmers. They are busy harvesting corn, soybeans, hauling manure and tilling their fields. They work day and night, so please be patient and drive safely around farm equipment.

Enjoy the Fall weather and colors while you can, because before you know it, snow will be on its way!

Cleaning your recyclable material is easy. Usually a quick rinse is sufficient. However, for stubborn foods like peanut butter jars – fill the jar with hot soapy water and give it a good shake. Let the jar soak overnight. The next day empty and recycle.

# **ROCKLAND 4-H NEWS**

As our 4-H year comes to a close – we are going out with a BANG. The month started out by taking a club trip to the Wisconsin State Fair on August 8. The club music group shared their performance of "America Sings" on the youth stage twice. The rest of the day was spent going through the barns, watching animal judging, getting ideas for next year, eating grilled cheese sandwiches, ice cream and going on a few rides. The Brown County Fair came next. The goal of getting our projects to the fair was a result of a year long amount of dedication and work, help from the parents and leaders, and plenty of FUN. Number of exhibits included: 20 chickens, 5 rabbits, 24 photo displays, 16 foods items, 14 art items, 2 Lego displays, 81 Ceramic items, 40 garden/flower items, 8 clothing items, 2 child care items, a club scrapbook, Booth display, and a flowering large plant/pot. We also created a Fair promotional display board which was set up at the Swan Club parking lot entrance. Friday of the fair we took our turn in helping in the county 4-H food stand. We made and served fair goers everything from grilled cheese and pizza to shakes and ice cream cups. Sunday, members of the club participated in the 4-H Fashion Show modeling items they made. Our members participated in the dress the animal contest, followed by 4-H Graduation, Cloverbud Recognition and Award Presentation. Our club had five members graduate from 4-H (Katelyn Simoens, Casey Sroda, Kaylee DeBeukelar, Olivia Kamps, and Brandi VanPay) and seven members promoted from Cloverbuds to 4-H members. Paris Riggle was awarded the "I Dare You Award" and Casey Sroda was awarded a 4-H Scholarship. In addition the Rockland 4-H Club was presented with the Brown County Home and Community Education Community Service Award. We also received the top Herdsmanship Award for Poultry.
