A NOTE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The Town Board members toured all our roads this spring for possible repairs and maintenance. At the May Town Board meeting, the Town Board decided to sealcoat and wedge the following roads /section of roads: Wrightstown Road, Old Military Road, Midway Road, Eiler Road, Deer Point Lane, Bildings Drive, Silver Quail Road, Van Deurzen Drive, Blake Road, Shirley Road and Morrison Road.

At our Annual Town Meeting in April, the question was asked about whether 4 wheelers & UTV's should be allowed to travel on Town roads. We would like input on this topic, so please email us or call one of the Town Board members or our Town Clerk. The Towns of Wrightstown, Glenmore and Morrison already have ordinances in place for 4 wheelers & UTVs on their Town roads.

The 4th of July holiday is weeks away. Please know the laws on which fireworks you can shoot off legally. Some fireworks require a signature from the Town Chairman before you can use them. The permits are supplied by the fireworks vendor. YOU are responsible for your own actions, not the Town.

On Sunday, July 21, 2019, from 10:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., the Greenleaf Volunteer Fire Department will be having their 98th Annual Picnic at the Greenleaf Fireman's Park in Greenleaf. This department serves over half of our township, so please come out and support this fundraiser. There will be games for all ages including a bounce house, raffles, food, booyah and refreshments, music, bucket brigade and co-ed blind man's volleyball competition.

As I write this letter more rain is coming, but at least we aren't under water like folks in the Midwest and parts of Wisconsin. Since our last newsletter, the Town Board toured all of Rockland's roads. In spite of a long winter and a very wet spring, the majority of our Town roads are in good shape; at least better than our County roads. Plan to see work trucks chip sealing later this month. Please slow down in these work areas.

Last week we had the annual "Board of Review". That's when residents could come and review their property taxes. No one appeared. Our Assessor must be doing a good job. State law requires property to be assessed within 10% of real market value. Our Assessor has maintained that valuation very well over the years. It's the level of taxes we all must pay that is of concern. I believe Rockland has controlled taxation fairly well. Of the over three million dollars we collect, only 15% is used by Rockland to provide the services; with the big ticket items being road maintenance and fire protection. The rest of your tax bill is from the schools, the County, and the technical college. By the way, I want to give credit to our Town Treasurer, Mary Van Dyck and also our Town Clerk Julie Koenig who together are responsible for keeping track of all those dollars and making sure the books balance at the end of the year. They do separate accounting but always come out to the penny. Good job ladies.

Recently, we've experienced garbage being thrown into some areas of our Town ditches and as a result Rockland is looking at installing cameras to help catch those responsible. Heavy fines will be imposed. We all want a nice looking neighborhood.

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
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
