A NOTE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

It's that time of year: road construction season! The Town Board toured all roads earlier this spring and came up with a list of repairs and maintenance on our roads: Goldust Drive, Goldust Court, Sundust Court, Shirley Road, Mizar Trace. New Plank, Tower road and Sportsman Drive will have wedging and full sealcoat applied also. School Road will have 6 inches of gravel added to existing surface and milled together and then double chip seal applied to the roadbed. We were awarded a \$15,000 grant from the TRIP program from the State of Wisconsin for this project. This road is one mile in length.

We also changed out two large culverts on Midway Road this spring. Half the cost of this project comes out of our bridge fund. We will also be doing work on the wingwalls of the bridge on Ryan Road. Over the years, the walls have been shifting and need to be repaired. This will also come out of the bridge fund.

With the 4th of July holiday only weeks away, please know the laws on shooting off fireworks. Some fireworks require a permit with a signature from the Town Chairman. Remember you are responsible for your own actions. With the pandemic almost over, it's sure nice to get out and enjoy the summer weather and festivals that come along with it. The Greenleaf Fireman's Picnic is back this year on July 18th. Please get out and support one of our volunteer fire departments' fund raiser. Enjoy the summer weather!

Recently, the board toured all town roads and determined which ones needed some work done . You will be seeing that soon as well. Our Chairman and Clerk were able to secure a grant through a federal program to redo Midway Road from 57 to CTH PP a year ago and now we are in the final stages of preparation. We were the only township in Brown county to be awarded a grant with cost sharing. The 2 large culverts were replaced near the intersection of Midway and Ryan Roads and hopefully next year all the work will be completed.

With the guidelines in regards to Covid updated and appearing to look more like a normal 4H program - we have a lot to catch up with: our community service programs, projects and our meetings. We started with some group fun with a June Dairy Month Build your own Ice Cream Sundae or a Root Beer Float - or both. Ice Cream, blueberries, strawberries, bananas, chocolate, butterscotch, caramel, whipped dairy cream and a cherry on top. We are back to our 4H Food stand at the Creekview Stables. This is our main money making event. We put up the tents, tables, fry brats, hamburgers, hot dogs, deserts, chips and beverages. The best part: visiting with horse owners and participants that we have not seen in a year. We have 4 events a year with all families taking a turn to help out during the day. Members greet customers, take/ make the orders and collect money and make change.

The Brown County Fair is August 18th to the 22nd, with entry day/face to face judging for most items on Tuesday, August 17th. We have resumed ceramics at our leaders home and meet twice a week. Lots of ceramic vases, dogs, horses, rabbits, stepping stones, ducks, decals and more items. We do the cleaning and painting and our leader does the kiln/firing for us. Rockland Dog License for 2021

Thank you to all that have obtained their dog licenses already. The fee is \$5.00 for a neutered or spayed dog. The fee for a dog that is not neutered or spayed is \$10.00. Please fill out the application and send a check to Mary Van Dyck, 2185 Deer Point Lane, De Pere, WI 54115. The application is also on the Rockland website. Remember it is a State law that you license your dog. The license also helps us find the owner when a dog gets away. I know no one wants to lose their dog, but sometimes it happens. If the dog has the tag on, we look up the number and call the owner. Your dog is returned to you safely. The tags on the dog are so important. In the town, about once a month a stray dog is found. If the tags are on, we can find the owner even if the dog belongs to someone in another township.

I hope everyone is doing well and is ready to enjoy the summer heat and sunshine. I want to thank everyone who came to the Town Recycling Day. We filled over 3 trucks with items that weighed approximately 22,500 pounds. I have scheduled another Recycling Day for April 16, 2022.

I have not heard of any problems with garbage pick up from the hauler, so I want to thank everyone for doing a great job. That means putting your bins at least 6 feet apart and having the wheels on the inside so the driver can dump the garbage without having to turn the container. A reminder to try and put your container in your driveway. Some of the bins are too far on the road and cars cannot meet without either hitting the bin or stopping. This is a minor problem that we have had but it seems that the problem has been handled successfully.

The Town has received a grant to help keep the cost of recycling down. The grant was for \$2,417.94. Keep up the good work of recycling so we can continue to apply for the grant.

ATV Safety

Please remember these common sense tips: Drivers must be 16 or older, have a drivers license and DNR safety certificate. Speed limit is 35 MPH. Only use Town Roads (not 57, W, PP, ZZ, OO). Kids must wear helmets and seat belts. Ride single file. Lights must be on. Use hand signals or directional lights. ATV/UTVs must have license plate and be registered. Golf carts are not permitted on any roads. Our roads will be chip sealed in the coming weeks. Do not slide around or turn circles on the chip seal or it will mess up the roadbeds. If we take care to use these vehicles safely, we can continue to use them for years to come.
