

November 8th General Election

Are you new to Rockland? Have you recently moved or changed your marital status? Have you recently turned 18? These are great reasons to update your voter registration. These things can be done in the clerk's office, or by visiting the voters website www.myvote.wi.gov. This site will also allow you to request an absentee ballot to be mailed to you. You may need to upload a photo of your drivers license. Doing these actions early ensures that your name will be in the poll book and that you will have time to get your absentee ballot back to me at the Clerk's office.

In person absentee voting will take place during Clerk's hours, starting on Tuesday, October 25 until Thursday, November 3rd, or by appointment.

Groundwater Testing

Recently, Brown County provided free sample kits for groundwater testing. They are trying to track improvements from conservation projects. Because we only received 10 free kits the first time around, I have requested more kits for the next sampling period which is scheduled for September 20th—October 7th. You may request them directly from Brown County by calling Angel at (920) 391-4634 or emailing her at Angel.Henschel@BrownCountyWI.gov.

Follow me on Facebook at Town of Rockland—Brown County for info as it becomes available. We may schedule a sample drop day and pick up so we don't all need to drive to UWGB. Thank you in advance. Testing your well every couple of years is recommended so get your free testing while it's still available. Thank you.

The Town of Rockland is going through the process of converting our email to dot.gov addresses. This will keep town information and correspondence more safe than ever in this age of cybersecurity concerns. We anticipate the change to occur the last week of August or early September. You will start to see messages come back notifying you of the change of address. All town addresses that follow the format of first initial, last name @ townofrockland.org will now be first initial last name @townofrocklandwi.gov. Please know that the former email addresses will remain live for some time but responses will likely show up with the .gov address.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS:

This winter property taxes will be payable to the Town of Rockland collected by Treasurer Mary Van Dyck. Brown County is no longer collecting for the Town of Rockland. More information will follow, but please make a note that Rockland will collect your property taxes for Town of Rockland properties this December/January.

There were 300 more school exhibits than last year. Also I want to thank the fair board for all their hard work to make it a good fair.
