

**Resolution #2013-3**

**Adopted by the**

**Town Board of the Town of Rockland of Brown County, Wisconsin**

Whereas, the Town of Rockland has been restricted and negatively impacted by an ordinance of a bordering city regarding land divisions and development in the Town of Rockland, and

Whereas, ss.59.69 (3) (b) of the Wisconsin state statutes requires that, if a county creates a county development plan, it must include a master plan adopted by a city or village, and

Whereas, ss.59.69 (3) (b) does not require and, in effect, ignores a master plan adopted by a town as to what should be included in a county development plan, and

Whereas, towns should be given greater consideration for having their planning efforts included in a county's development plan, and

Whereas, town boards and planning commissions are in position to have a better understanding and appreciation for their town's social and geological characteristics, the future needs of its residents, and the nature of its potential growth,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Rockland to request Wisconsin state legislators to co-sponsor, support and pass a bill to repeal ss.59.69 (3) (b) of the Wisconsin state statutes.
