2018 Municipal Maintenance Agreement with Brown County Public Works

The Board reviewed and discussed what maintenance services, if any, should be contracted with Brown County for 2018. The contract from 2017 was compared with 2018's contract. Notable differences include the specification that if the general maintenance option is not chosen, and Brown County services are required, there will be a mobilization fee of \$500. Brown County requires a dollar value be indicated on the contract. Chairman Cashman recommended the general maintenance, signage and traffic control, bridge maintenance and bridge inspection

M/M by Supervisor Lasee to approve the 2018 Maintenance Agreement with Brown County Public Works for general maintenance services, including bridge maintenance and inspections, and signage and traffic control, for a total of \$1,000; seconded by Supervisor Van Vonderen. Motion carried.

2017-18 Sodium Chloride Agreement with Wisconsin Department of Transportation

Chairman Cashman provided a summary of the Town's use of salt for the 2016-17 season. A new agreement with the state of Wisconsin for the purchase of sodium chloride for the 2017-18 season was provided. It does not include the price per ton for salt. This agreement must be submitted to the Department of Transportation no later than April 15, 2017, to allow the Town to purchase salt for the 2017-18 season. After discussion, it was determined that Carter could hold 155 additional tons. As such the following order was prescribed: Early Fill - 110 ton; Seasonal Fill - 22 ton; Vendor reserve- 26 ton Storage available combined salt and/or 1 part salt/3 parts sand blend Two hundred ton is the maximum storage capacity of the two items: sand/salt blend, and road salt.

M/M by Chairman Cashman to purchase road salt from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation in the following amounts. Early Fill - 110 ton; Seasonal Fill - 22 ton; Vendor reserve- 26 ton for the 2017-18 season; seconded by Supervisor Lasee. Motion carried.

Petition for County Bridge Fund Aid

Jann shared the petition for projects in 2018. Brown County has levied \$15,000 for 2018. Our balance is \$63,231.67 in the bridge fund. Electors have approved \$15,000. Brown County is asking each municipality what projects will be undertaken in 2018, so the county can prepare to match the investment amount. Supervisor Van Vonderen suggested that during the road inspection a list be compiled to detail the projects that could be submitted. The report is due May 26th. Among projects being considered: Tetsloff Road, Old Martin Road, Ryan Road bridge (72.3% life still remains). A resolution is required for action.

M/M by Supervisor Van Vonderen to table the discussion to a future meeting pending the results of the road inspection; seconded by Supervisor Lasee. Motion carried.

Excess Stadium District tax monies

Copies were provided to the Supervisors to indicate the balances of the bank accounts as of March 31, 2017, as well as the criteria for the Stadium District tax money. Little information exists to define the type of projects that the funds can be used on. Three types or categories exist and each was described. Discussion revolved around debt reduction and road construction. Road costs continue to rise – use the funds now to avoid higher road construction costs in the future. Several projects were shared. A resolution must be made to specifically state how the funds would be used. The Town Clerk suggested that the Board define what economic development means for the Town of Rockland. Supervisor Lasee suggested that a decision be made prior to the annual meeting.

M/M Chairman Cashman to start the process of determining how to use the excess stadium tax money; to write a resolution to use \$50,000 for debt reduction, and \$40,000 toward economic development projects. Seconded by Supervisor Lasee.

Wisconsin Document Imaging Proposal to upgrade copier to a color unit

Deputy Clerk Koenig presented a new contract for a copier upgrade from WDI. Wisconsin Document Imaging proposed a new color copier the same monthly investment by taking advantage of a government pricing program. Currently color copies are being purchased at an additional cost. Toner would be included, however a special surge protector would cost \$99. Less than six months remain on the current contract.

M/M by Supervisor Van Vonderen to enter in to an agreement with WDI for a term of 48 months for the new copier, seconded by Chairman Cashman. Motion carried.

Building/Zoning Report

Bob Gerbers reported that in March there were 2 permits issued 1) finish basement on Moonriver \$10,000; 2) to WPS for utility work in right of way. The total value of the projects equals \$. 10,000. A total of \$425.00 was received in permit fees of which \$250.00 was paid to Gerbers for inspection fees.

The condition of the yard at 5327 St Hwy 57 remains a topic of concern. Mr. Gerbers indicated some interest in the property of the former Town Hall. The brick has been hauled out. The property is currently zoned commercial.

Chairman's Report

Chairman Cashman reported there are road signs to be reinstalled in three locations. Weight limits will continue for 1.5 weeks. The Rockland sign on the Thomasma property will remain an issue as readability is very limited.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Van Dyck provided a written financial report to the Board. Planning and appeals has taken in more money than expected, as has building permits. Dog licenses are coming in regularly. Efforts to open a new account for bridge money was stalled as the bank contact was on vacation. It will be completed tomorrow. When Hickory Ridge is paid out of that fund, the balance will go below \$50,000. The current interest rate of .3% requires a balance of >= \$50,000. \$10,000 was put in the contingency fund this year. Chairman Cashman directed the Treasurer to move \$5,000 from the General Fund to Capital Improvement.

M/M by Chairman Cashman to accept the financial report; seconded by Supervisor Van Vonderen. Motion carried.
